

Winchelsea Uniform Policy

Rationale:

Winchelsea Primary School reinforces in students a pride in their own appearance, to instil recognition of themselves as an integral part of the school community and to assist in developing pride in representing their school. This policy is supported by a Dress Code which is inclusive of, but not limited to, issues of equality, health, safety and expense.

Aims:

- To promote equality amongst all students.
- To further develop a sense of pride in, and identification with our school.
- To provide durable clothing that is cost effective and practical for our school environment.
- To maintain and enhance the positive image of the school in the community.

Implementation:

- A rigorous consultative process will guide School Council and relevant stakeholders, in the modification of the Dress Code.
- The Dress Code applies during school hours, while travelling to and from school, and when students are on school excursions.
- Uniforms will be prescribed and are required to be worn as stated in the Dress Code.
- Students are encouraged to wear only the approved uniform with the school logo.
- When representing the school in special events, where possible a 'uniform' will be provided for each participant. Eq. choir, sporting competitions.
- The Dress Code, including details of uniform items and protocol for purchasing, will be published in the newsletter and school website at the beginning of each term.

Arrangements can be made to supply uniforms via State Schools economic hardships. Parents are directed to contact the Princ

- Parents seeking exemptions to the Dress Code due to religious beliefs, ethnic or cultural background, student disability health condition or economic hardship are encouraged to contact the Principal/Nominee to discuss furthe
- Parents are encouraged to provide a written explanation if their child is out of uniform.
- New uniforms are available from the office. Used uniforms are available from the second hand uniform shop.
- The school uniform includes a broad brimmed hat which must be worn from 1st September until 30th April for all outside activities.
- Shoes and socks are for foot protection, so thongs, crocs or open toed sandals are not allowed.
- Jewellery is not acceptable other than studs or sleepers in ears and a watch.
- Makeup is not acceptable, this includes nail polish
- Shoulder length hair is to be tied up

- Sports Uniform Royal blue shorts or navy blue bike shorts, school polo top or track pants. Navy sport skort
- Year 6 windcheater and polo shirt available for all Year 6 students.
